Today many families are lured by the worldly spirit and have lost the place for God's spirit in our families. It has caused unending problems and challenges to our families. During this Family & life week let us pray in a special way and do something family sprit and make our families a place where there is love, peace, and joy and where God dwells.

REFLECTION

After the resurrection of Jesus, he revealed himself in many and different ways to the disciples. These appearances of Jesus to the disciples reveal God's initiative. In today's he who opened the disciples' minds and hearts to understand the Scriptures. It was he who made them recognize that it was he at the breaking of the bread. The repeated revelations of Jesus to his followers prove that Jesus is a changeless friend/unfailing friend who will stand by us always. Those who saw the risen Lord have narrated their joyful experiences. Living in the presence of Jesus is the joy of our life.

The risen Jesus is always close to us but in most cases, he is not recognized by us; we fail to recognize him. Mary Magdalene mistook him for gardener and the two disciples of Emmaus considered him a stranger who did not know the realities of the world. It is an indication that the risen Lord cannot be seen by any 'eye' but only those 'eyes' of faith, and the 'eyes' of those who look for him with sincere hearts. The resurrection of Jesus urges us to believe God and to trust in His providence.

The risen Lord has been proclaimed by the Church for centuries. We too have experienced the risen Jesus in various ways at various times through various events during our faith journey. As disciples of Christ, we need to share our experience with our co-travelers and give witness to the risen Christ. The best witness of the resurrection of Jesus is a life witness, that is, living as resurrection people or as people who believe in the resurrection.
