ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is a universal day of fasting and abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence from meat binds those who are 14 and older and the law of fasting binds those from 18 to 59 years of age. Parents are reminded of their duty to introduce children gradually to the understanding and practice of penance. During Lent, penance is an important requirement of the Christian life. Fulfillment of this duty involves prayer, works of piety and charity, and self-denial by observing the prescribed fast abstinence.



FRIDAYS

Fridays are days of abstinence from meat but one may substitute special acts of charity or piety on this day.


LENT: A TIME FOR CLEANSING THE HEART

This year Ash Wednesday falls on the 2nd of March. We begin this season of Lent by receiving ashes on our foreheads. Lent is a time for cleansing the heart by practicing prayer, penance, fasting, and alms-giving. Prayer is the daily practice of our friendship with God, and it opens the way to eternal life. While we appreciate our food and enjoy a good meal, we should also find a place for fasting. The main goal of Lenten fasting is not a well-toned body to be proud of but to sharpen our appetite for God. By alms-giving we serve the needy, not to be praised as generous, but to imitate God's generosity to us.

Thus, during Lent, we are asked to tune in to higher desires, to deep-down longing for God. The forty days of Lent echo the time Jesus spent in the desert before his public ministry. Lent is meant to help us to a more effective Christian lifestyle. Augustine says "God means to fill us with what is good — so cast out what is bad! If God wishes to fill us with honey and we are full of sour wine, where is the honey to go? The vessel must first be emptied and cleansed." Lent is the golden opportunity for us to empty our vessels of sour wine and cleanse our hearts to celebrate the paschal mystery and to welcome the risen Lord.
