

REFLECTIONS

On the second Sunday of Lent, we are called to reflect and meditate on the meaning and significance of the Transfiguration of our Lord on the mountain. It can also be called a mountain top experience. Through the Transfiguration of Jesus, God opened the eyes of his disciples, Peter, John, and James, and gave them a glimpse of God's abiding presence with their Master, Jesus. This was God's way of delivering the disciples from their crisis of faith. This event strengthened the disciples of their faith and belief that Jesus is the beloved Son of God and He is the Messiah who has come as the fulfillment of the Law as well as the Prophets. God enlightened their vision and thereby they were reinforced in their discipleship. Thus the Gospel of today invites us in a very special way to become aware of our own mountain top experiences, God experience in our life, to understand God's accompanying presence and strengthening assurance in our lives, particularly in moments of crisis.

MADAGASCAR: AN ECOLOGICAL VILLAGE TO COPE WITH CLIMATE CHANGE



Development and Peace's *People and Planet First* campaign celebrates what solidarity can achieve, even against seemingly impossible odds.

In Madagascar, for instance, Development and Peace's partner, the Development Council of Andohatapenaka (CDA), empowers people to manage and transform their neighbourhoods.

In the capital region, which is afflicted by flooding and poor waste management, CDA has helped the residents of one vulnerable area to turn their environs into a thriving ecological village. Today, each of the 50 households involved

in the project has a vegetable garden, a stove and solar panels. This transformation reflects a true ecological conversion.
