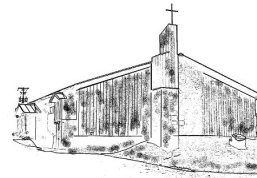

REFLECTIONS

The Jewish officials were envious of the apostles because their preaching of the risen Lord and His teachings was attracting many people to the Christian faith. They strictly ordered them not to preach but they went around preaching boldly. In today's first reading we see Paul and Barnabas speaking fearlessly to the Jewish officials. In the Gospel, we see Jesus is also speaking fearlessly about the mission entrusted to Him by the Father. Jesus, Barnabas, Paul, and even other disciples were all filled with zeal and enthusiasm to proclaim the Good News that their conviction was reflected in their speech as well as their lives. They were ready to face any opposition or any challenge because, as we hear in the reading, "The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit." There are occasions in our own lives when we are called to speak with conviction when we are called to witness to the faith even in adverse circumstances. Like the Apostles, as the followers of Christ, it is our responsibility then to fearlessly witness to the faith, to speak for Christ, to work for the community in the name of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. But like the apostles, we will also need to be filled with Holy Spirit to do that. Today, therefore, we need to ask the risen Lord to fill us with His Spirit and empower us so that we may give witness to our faith in Jesus courageously in our present-day circumstances. And the Gospel reminds us that we should not be afraid to do the Lord's work because He is with us and leads us as the Good Shepherd.
