

#### REFLECTION

Today is the feast of Christ the King. He is the universal King, the King of Kings. Christ's Kingship is totally different from all the other kings we know of, for, His kingdom is built on the values of love and service. The Gospel passage of today brings out this truth of Christ's Kingship in a powerful way through the irony of the taunts of the leaders and the soldiers. It highlights Jesus' real identity as well as the true meaning of his death. The leaders and the soldiers thought that they were ridiculing Jesus when they said, "if you are the King of the Jews, save yourself". They also hanged an inscription over him which read, "This is the King of the Jews". However, when they did all these, they were not aware that this is exactly the kind of King that he has come to be. Although Jesus is the King of Kings, He is a King that rules the hearts of people and not their territories. Christ our King does not dominate, instead serves; He does not have an army but has disciples; He does not take life, instead gives life. Jesus wants to save his people from their miseries and from their perils.

As we come to the end of the liturgical year and prepare ourselves to celebrate the birthday of Jesus and welcome him, our eternal King, we need to realize the fact that our King can come into our lives only if we are willing to open our hearts and minds for him. We can do this by removing from our minds and hearts anything that will block his entry into our lives. We can do this by reaching out to the people in love and forgiveness as he did. So, are we ready and willing to receive Christ the King into our lives and make him our King who can rule, guide and protect our lives?
