Pentecost: Today is the <u>Pentecost Sunday</u>. On Pentecost Sunday we celebrate the <u>outpouring of the Holy Spirit</u> on the Apostles. The descent of the Holy Spirit empowered the timid apostles and enabled them to go around the whole world preaching the Gospel boldly. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church by the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith. Pentecost is, thus, the official birthday of the Church. We too have received the gift of the Holy Spirit when we were infused with sanctifying grace, the life of God in our souls when we received the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. The Spirit transforms us and strengthens us to live a good Christian life. Today as we commemorate the feast of Pentecost, let us open our hearts and ask the Lord once again to fill us with His grace and renew in us the gifts of the Holy Spirit. So that may we always remain strong in our faith and faithful to Our Lord even when we are faced with challenges and give witness to him through our lives.

Sacramental Programs

Our Sacramental programs are cluing up for the year. We would like to congratulate the children on having done a great job and thank you to the parents for encouraging the children to attend as well as bringing them to class and mass.

If your child has just completed the first year of either the first communion program or the confirmation program, you will have to register them for the second year of these courses. You can do this by dropping by or calling the church Monday to Friday between the hours of 9am-12pm. We would like to have all registration in by mid-September so we can get classes started early October.

A little information for other parents/guardians who are interested in registering their children in either program for the first time:

First year First communion class-----Children have to be in at least **grade one**, the classes are once a month. We do start our sessions during Sunday mass and continue on after mass usually for an hour. This is a two-year program.

Second Year First Communion---- Children have to have done the first-year program. The sessions may vary, generally it is once a month some months the session may run a little longer as a retreat. More information would be given at the first parents meeting. During this year children will receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion for the first time.

First year Confirmation---Children would have to be in at least **grade seven** to attend these classes. The program is once a month usually right after mass, depending on the catechist this may change. This is also a two-year program.

Second Year Confirmation---Children have to have completed first year confirmation to register for this program. The classes are once a month. The classes are usually right after mass. During this year the children will be confirmed.
