REFLECTIONS

With the Palm Sunday Celebration today we enter into the Holy Week, the great week of the liturgical year. This is the time the Christian community stops to remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation. By commemorating and reliving the dying and rising of Jesus this week, we are, in fact, celebrating our own dying and rising in Jesus, which will result in our reconciliation with our heavenly Father, and salvation of our souls. Active and attentive participation in the Holy Week liturgy will certainly deepen our relationship with God, increase our Faith, and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus.

The Holy Week celebrations also remind us of the betrayal of the crowd as well as the desertion of the apostles. Judas, one of his twelve apostles, sold Jesus off for thirty pieces of silver, Peter denied Him three times and other disciples fled away from the scene. Like them, many of us change our attitude toward God, as per our convenience. Often we say "yes" to his word but at the slightest provocation, we are ready to betray him. Holy week is also the time to remember that God remains faithful despite our inconstancy and unfaithfulness and waits for our acceptance of him as our Lord and Savior.
