### REFLECTION

The liturgy of the Word today focuses on the life after death. Most of the Israelites believed in life after death, particularly believed in the resurrection of the dead. But the Sadducees who were the wealthy and influential people in the Israelite society out rightly denied it. They tried to lessen the authority of Jesus with their question about the resurrection. But Jesus gave them a fitting reply by pointing out to them that the resurrection is a reality which should be experienced and not speculated.

The resurrection of the dead became the major precept of Christianity after the resurrection of Jesus Christ and today Resurrection is the foundation of Christian Faith. We are resurrection people and we should live a meaningful life. A meaningful life for a Christian is a life that is lived with the hope of meeting the risen Lord in heaven. So what is important is how and with what attitude we live our lives today. St. Paul in his early letters to First and second Thessalonians tells that life as such is very short and therefore, we should be industrious at all times. We need to prepare ourselves to return to God our Creator through sacrifices, alms-giving and good deeds as on Judgement day our judgement will be given based on love.
